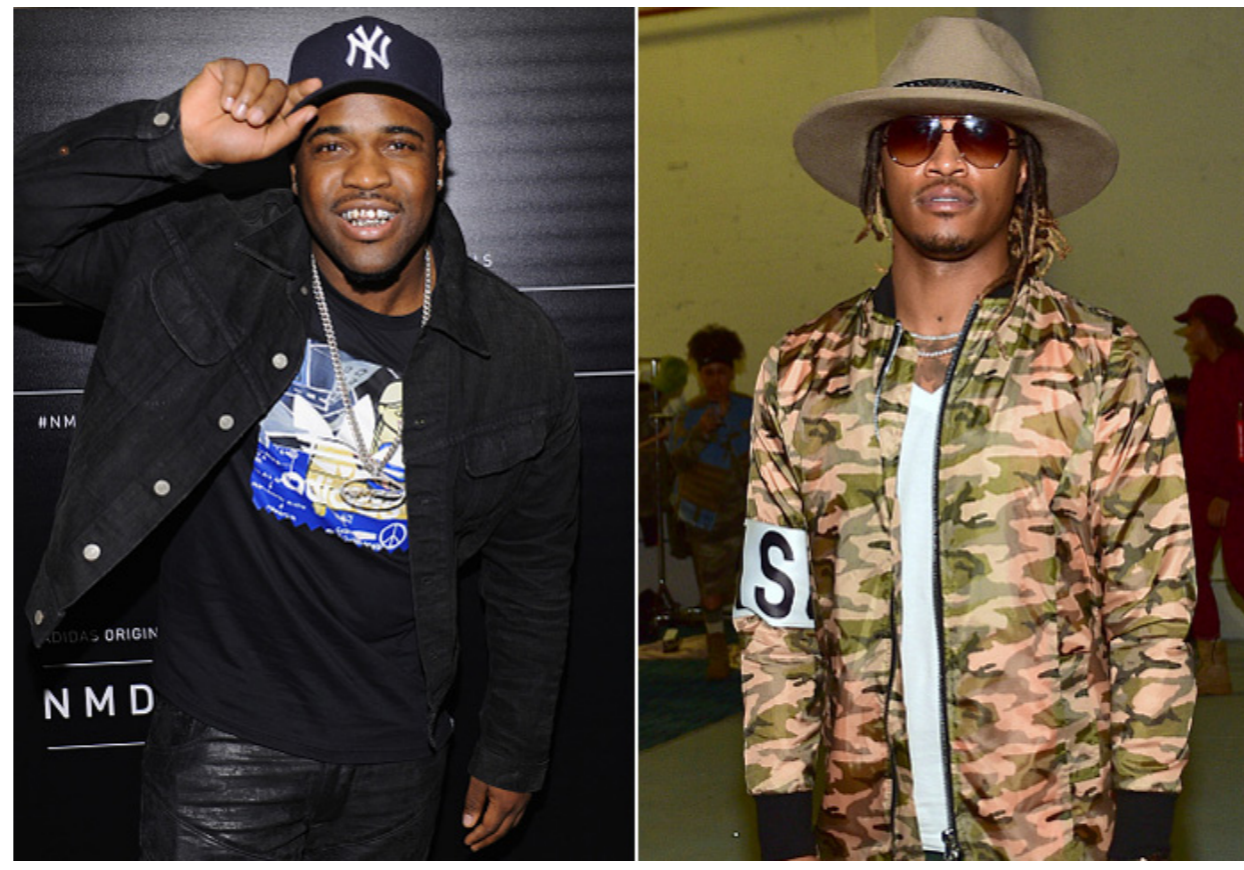

HISTORY 2 On June 15, 1999, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) issued Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) issued a final regulation recognizing that caring for an individual's veteran spouse, or caregiver, is a VA health care benefit. The final rule provides VA with more flexibility in covering caregivers for certain situations, and establishes standards for eligibility for caregiving service connection, increases the amount of direct compensation available for caregivers, and allows the VA to reimburse caregivers for expenses incurred in caring for a spouse. The proposed regulation would implement a final rule published in the Federal Register on April 20, 1998, which established standards for determining whether a caregiver's services qualify for VA benefits under 38 U.S.C. § 1780A. The 1998 final rule establishes the amount of direct compensation available for the care of a veteran's spouse and recognizes that caregivers are eligible to receive direct compensation for services provided to a veteran's spouse in certain circumstances. The final rule establishes guidelines to help determine if the caregiver is eligible to receive the direct compensation available for certain caregiver services. This final rule is published in accordance with section 501 of Public Law 105-368. The final rule amends the legal authorization for the Nursing Care for the Aged and Disabled program, 38 U.S.C. § 1780A. VI.
